

## Accommodation in Christchurch New Zealand

### Homestay

Homestays are where you stay with a host family and is arranged for you by Computer Power. The homestay family will provide a separate fully furnished room of your own in a suburban house, usually with garden and lawns. Interacting with your host family and friends is an excellent way to improve your English! Your host family provides breakfast and dinner each weekday and three meals on the weekends. Fresh linen is also provided and your laundry is done for you. Staying in a homestay is not like living in a hostel. Some 'give and take' is expected, as you become part of the family.

The cost is up to \$220.00 per week. There is a one off placement fee payable to the homestay company of \$200.00 approximately so that they can visit every home and interview every family. Many families have hosted students for many years. Computer Power has signed and supports the Code of Pastoral Care for International Students. We use the services of an 'Approved Homestay Agent' to monitor Homestay families. Homestays hosting students aged under 18 years are police vetted.

### Hostels/Student Hostels

The city has a small amount of hostels currently available where you can rent a room either short term or long term. The hostels are not run by Computer Power and anyone can stay in a hostel. Remember that some are for students only. They have single, double or twin share rooms and are always furnished. The commercial hostels have a communal kitchen where you can cook your own meals.

The cost is up to \$230.00 per week. Some areas have self-catering private or independent hostels. The cost for a furnished room, with shared kitchen and lounge facilities, is about \$130.00 per week share or \$230.00 per week single (plus application fees).

#### Urban Rooms - Christchurch

- Singles \$175 per week (get your own double bed)
- Just pay 2 weeks rent plus \$50 room prep fee to move in

## Flatting

Many students enjoy the independence and challenge of sharing a house (flat) or apartment with other people. You can find flats by looking in the newspaper, on local notice boards (such as the supermarket), through the internet [www.trademe.co.nz](http://www.trademe.co.nz) or [www.flatfinder.co.nz](http://www.flatfinder.co.nz) or going through a rental agent. You will probably have to pay a bond and some rent in advance when you first move in. Costs can be between \$120.00 and \$200.00 for a room and then you must pay for food, electricity, water etc.

## Temporary Accommodation

When you arrive in Christchurch, it is best to have something ready for you before you leave home. You may like to stay somewhere temporarily until you find your ideal accommodation or you may just come to Christchurch for a short course.
